ABORIGINAL PEOPLE HAVE LESS RIGHTS THAN CHICKENS

An Aboriginal man (who can't swim) was thrown from the SeaCat ferry by an employee of the racist Mandorah Hotel, Friday 16 June, 2000. The strong current off the jetty is deadly - even to strong swimmers. N.T. Police did not charge the Mandorah Hotel employee responsible for this assault, endangerment of life and interference with a publicly chartered vessel.



Mandorah Hotel staff are also responsible for the bashing of another Aboriginal man who stole some alcohol, at the Mandorah Hotel on November 12, 1999. Steven, the victim of this vigilante attack, who stated, "They beat me like a dog," was later imprisoned for three months under the Territory's racist, mandatory sentencing laws. One crime, two punishments. NT Police did nothing, apart from attempting to cover-up the incidents, with local racists. The NT NEWS refused to report either of these racist attacks.

One political activist has already been imprisoned for throwing a chicken at a US Navy vessel during an East Timor protest. PARI AH's Co-ordinator faces imprisonment for the same political 'offence'. The NT Police and NT News both claim to be politically and racially neutral. So why does a chicken have more rights than an Aboriginal person in the NT? The answer is obvious. The individuals who comprise the NT Police and the NT News are the willing puppets of a system that has condoned and covered-up racist genocide for over 200 years in Australia. SHAME YOU MOB !
